#### **VIETNAM**

#### **Our Study of Other Cultures**

On Tuesday 20th November, the Swamp had a Vietnamese Day. We had a fantastic day and we learnt much about the lifestyle of Vietnamese people. These are some of the things we learnt about Vietnam. The size of Vietnam is 331 700 sq km. The population is 89 million and the population density is 265 people /sq km. Australia's population density is only 2.9 people / sq km. The major ethic groups are the Champa from India and the Khmer. We talked about the history of North and South Vietnam and the effects of the Vietnam War. Another fact about Vietnam is that their currency is Vietnamese Dong. \$1 Aus = 20 000VND. If you want to convert VND to Aus Dollars, you need to divide by 20 000 by taking away four zeros and halving it. We had a great time.

Vietnam is a tropical country in Asia. The Swamp compared life in Vietnam with Australia and found it was very different. We also made and ate some soup. The food The Swamp made was very tasty Chicken Pho, which is Chicken Soup. The ingredients were chicken, chicken necks, chili, jalapenos, coriander, bean sprouts, vermicelli, lime, fish sauce and ginger. There was also a vegetarian soup with Tofu. We learnt some things about the Vietnamese lifestyle. Some parts of Vietnam are poor and some parts are wealthy. Vietnamese people are mostly Buddhist or follow Confucianism. Vietnamese people ride around on bikes, sometimes carrying 3, 4 or even 5 people.

On Monday 19<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> November, the Swamp had two Vietnamese Days involving learning a lot about Vietnam. We tried some Vietnamese food (Chicken Pho) and compared Vietnam to Australia and Japan, which we have also been studying. We also dressed in Vietnamese, Australian or Japanese clothing.

Monday and Tuesday this week were 'Vietnam Days'. We learned so much about Vietnam and were able to dress as either an Australian, Japanese or Vietnamese person. I chose to be an Australian. Some of the things we learnt were:

- -Vietnamese people ride bicycles everywhere
- there is very little refrigeration
- almost everyone has a TV.
- one Vietnamese Dong equals 20 000 Aussie Dollars

I learnt a large amount of information about their transport, schools, cities, streets, government, money and technology.

On Tuesday we made Chicken Pho (soup). We were able to add ingredients like chili, coriander, fish sauce, tofu, ginger, chicken and vermicelli to our very own hand made chicken broth. Our end result was delicious except for poor Ellie who didn't have a fabulous 1st experience with chili. We also saw a video and some photos of Vietnam. Apart from the chili incident, we both enjoyed it!!!

Teranga uses the energy and musical heritage of Africa to take students on a journey guided and inspired by their own inner music; the heartbeat. The ensemble introduces every student to their own inner music, then transport them to Africa where they learn to use it, through dance, percussion and other instruments. Students learn to listen to their own intuitions, connect with nature and communicate, create and share with others.

This performance is part of your school's learning program and builds on preparatory work done in the classroom utilising the Teranga resource kit. The kit's teaching resources are linked directly to the music curriculum as well as other curriculum areas especially around literacy and numeracy.


