Aquatic Awareness Program & Gold Day 2012

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

On Tuesday 18thDecember, 2012, Surf Life Saving Australia will visit Jamberoo PS in the morning and present an aquatic awareness program that will incorporate fun activities to develop the students' beach safety awareness and skills. During this session students will learn about surf and beach safety.

Following this, students who have achieved Gold Level in our merit system are invited to attend our special Gold Reward Day.

This year our Gold Day is to be run in conjunction with the Surf Awareness Program. We will travel by bus to Surf Beach Kiama for a picnic lunch and then continue activities with a Beachsmart Program involving Nippers style activities such as beach sprints, flags, water wade and team relays. The day will be run by members of the South Coast Branch of Surf Lifesaving.

We will then return to school by bus by 3:00pm.

Students who have not achieved Gold will continue with the Beachsmart Program at school.

Travel: Bus for Gold students

Cost: There is no cost for this day

What to wear: Gold students may wear swimming costumes and appropriate sun safe clothing, a hat and sunscreen. Sun safe clothing means that shoulders must be covered - NO singlet or midriff tops.

Students must also wear safe footwear eg joggers, sandals that buckle. Thongs and loose shoes are not permitted.

Students not travelling to Kiama Surf Beach may also wear sun safe clothing.

What to bring: Students may bring thongs for wearing from the park to the beach, a towel, picnic lunch and plenty to drink.

Please note: Students staying at school do not need to return a permission note.
