This year's Carols in the Park starts at 7:15. All families & friends are invited. Students who are performing please wear something with the colours red, green or white.

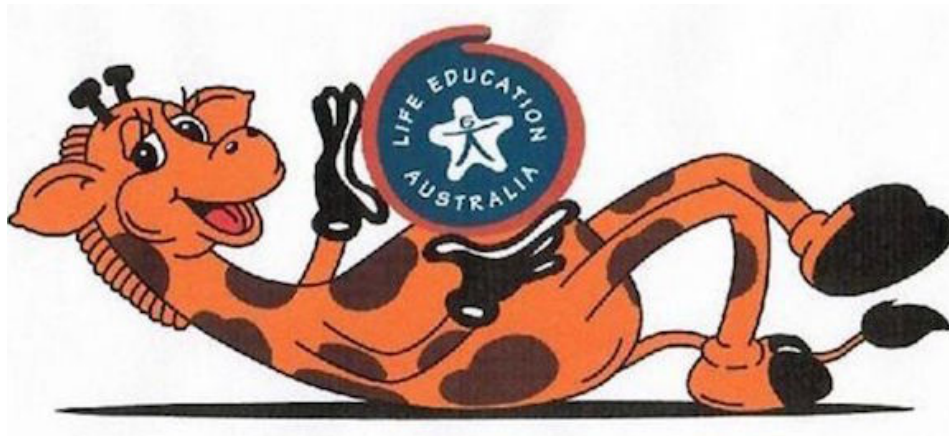
