

Library News

Thank you everyone for your support of the Scholastic Book Fair 'Buy One – Donate One to the School Library' Fair. The extra books donated to the library from the fair will have a book plaque recognising each child's donation. Keep on Keeping on Reading.

Although the 2016 Premier's Reading Challenge has closed, Jamberoo readers have already started the 2017 Challenge. An easy way to keep track of the books completed before the 2017 website opens is through 'Oliver'. Oliver and each student's individual Orbit page can be accessed via the Department of Education student portal. The link for Oliver is in the upper right hand corner of the child's home page. Click on Oliver and then Orbit (the little circle icon) on the right.

A student (and teachers) can check books that are currently borrowed, search for titles for leisure and research, check if a book is currently on loan or available, reserve a favourite and view past records of loans. It is easy to recognise books because most searches are displayed with an image of the particular book cover.

Premier Reading Challenge books are marked with a 'bookworm icon' and new PRC books with two bookworms.

What a fun way to find out more about our library and Oliver. Oliver can be accessed at home as well as at school so books out or overdue can be checked before Wednesday's library lesson.


P&C Blurb
