This area is unsafe, as staff may be reversing their cars during the time that students and parents are leaving the school grounds. The gates at the northern and southern ends of the school will still be open for families to access.

The recent tragedy at Banksia Road Public School highlights the importance of schools needing to implement as many safety protocols as possible to ensure the safety of their students and the community. In the future, the school will also be looking into painting fluorescent lines at both ends of the staff car park to highlight to students and their families where the out of bounds area exactly is. Care Monkey

The school will have Care Monkey up and running by early next year. As part of the

'going live' process, parents will be sent an email requesting medical and contact information for their child. The email will be sent to families next week. The school requests that you complete all of the required details before the end of Term 4. This will allow the school to go live early next year once we have the details of our new Kindergarten students and our new enrolments in other grades. If you haven't yet provided the school with an email address could you please do so as soon as possible. You will then receive the email requesting your child's medical information. As Care Monkey is a 2018 initiative, families who have a child in Year 6 will not receive an email requesting for them to provide a profile for their Year 6 child.

Once Care Monkey is up and running, the school will have up to date medical and contact details of all of our students, which can be accessed at the touch of a button. This will ensure that families can be contacted immediately in emergency situations and whilst on school excursions. It is important that **ALL** parents register their child's details for the Care Monkey program to be successful. The P&C has fully endorsed and is very supportive of the Care Monkey initiative. Your child's medical records will be protected through the latest security measures.

The days of written permission notes will also be over. All notes next year will be distributed digitally through Care Monkey. No more looking through your child's school bag for notes covered in Vegemite or peanut butter.

The school has increased in size quite rapidly over the past 12 months. This time last year we had 95 students, now our student enrolments are at 124. Student enrolment numbers have a huge effect on school structures. We are currently running five mainstream classes and are very close to a sixth class in 2018. If you, or anyone else you know, is planning to enrol children at Jamberoo Public School in 2018 it is vital that you contact the school as soon as possible to confirm the enrolment(s). Alternatively, if you know that in 2018 you will be relocating from Jamberoo and your child/children will not be enrolling at the school it is very important that you make this known to us so we have an accurate picture of student numbers for next year. Your cooperation and communication in this matter is very much appreciated.
