The data will be sent to the Department of Education and a decision will be made by the Department if there is enough of a need to have an OSHC provider at Jamberoo Public School.

#### Care Monkey

The school has successfully been utilising the Care Monkey program for the last year. As part of the process for **new Kindergarten families**, parents have been sent an email requesting medical and contact information for their child. The school requests that you complete all of the required details before the end of Term 4. This will allow the school to have updated student details for all of our students. Parents of students currently enrolled at the school will not be required to create a profile for their child/children. The current student medical and contact details will remain current in 2019.

The P&C has fully endorsed and is very supportive of the Care Monkey initiative. Your child's medical records will be protected through the latest security measures.

The days of written permission notes are over. All notes are distributed digitally through Care Monkey. No more looking through your child's school bag for notes covered in Vegemite or peanut butter.


