## Outside School Hours Care (OSHC) Service

The school was informed last week that there were no third-party tenders submitted to provide an OSHC service at Jamberoo Public School in 2020. This was a disappointing result for the school and the Jamberoo community as a before and after school care service is very much needed. The school will continue to push for an OSHC in the future and we thank everyone who took the time to complete the OSHC survey earlier in the term.

## Jamberoo Public School Community Charter

At the P&C meeting in Week 3 the school presented to the P&C representatives a Community Charter which outlines the responsibilities of all school stakeholders to ensure that the school environment is supportive and respectful. The Community Charter was well received by the P&C, and its members were in agreement that the document will be helpful in providing clear and explicit expectations for parents and Jamberoo staff.

## Student Enrolments 2020

The school has continued to grow over the past 12 months. Our current student enrolments are at 143 and our projected numbers for next year are 149. Student enrolment numbers have a huge effect on school structures. We are currently running six mainstream classes and are moving closer to a seventh class. If you, or anyone else you know, is planning to enrol children at Jamberoo Public School in 2020 it is vital that you contact the school as soon as possible to confirm the enrolment(s). Alternatively, if you know that in 2020 you will be relocating from Jamberoo and your child/children will not be enrolling at the school it is very important that you make this known to us, so we have an accurate picture of student numbers for next year. Your cooperation and communication in this matter is very much appreciated.



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## Care Monkey

The school has successfully been utilising the Care Monkey program for the past two years. As part of the process for **new Kindergarten families**, parents will be sent an email requesting medical and contact information for their child. The email will be sent to families in the next couple of weeks. The school requests that you complete all of the required details before the end of Term 4. This will allow the school to have updated student details for all of our students. Parents of students currently enrolled at the school will not be required to create a profile for their child/children. The current student medical and contact details will remain current in 2020.

The P&C has fully endorsed and is very supportive of the Care Monkey initiative. Your child's medical records will be protected through the latest security measures.

The days of written permission notes are over. All notes are distributed digitally through Care Monkey. No more looking through your child's school bag for notes covered in Vegemite or peanut butter.

#### What is ok in the area of communication?

What is ok	What is not ok
Having a concern and contacting the school to discuss the problem with the class teacher.	Coming to the school office or the classroom and demanding to talk to some straight away.
Making a time to talk through an issue with a staff member when you are calm and in effective control.	Yelling at or abusing any staff member, either over the phone or in person.
Talking calmly and respectfully to staff.	Swearing at any staff member in any situation, at any school event.
Use of social media to contact the school respectfully.	Making public negative or defamatory comments on social media.
Making a mutually convenient time to meet with your child's teacher by contacting the school office.	Expecting to talk to the class teacher in the morning while students are entering the classroom.
Visiting the classroom at an agreed time to view your child's learning environment.	Entering the classroom when the teacher is not present.
Contacting a staff member of the school via the school contact number or email.	Contacting staff members regarding a school issue directly through either their personal mobile number or direct email unless you have been specifically invited to.
Making an appointment with the Principal or Assistant Principal to discuss an issue and reporting to the front office prior to entering office areas.	Coming to the school and bypassing the office to enter one of the office areas.

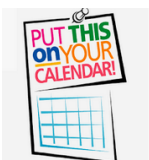
