#### National School Chaplaincy Programme

The reason given was that interest in the initiative had exceeded the funding provided by the Commonwealth and that there was insufficient funding to enable Jamberoo Public School to participate in the program.

We Do 2.0 is a fantastic teaching tool that combines science, engineering and robotics and is suitable for the primary years. I am really looking forward to introducing this
