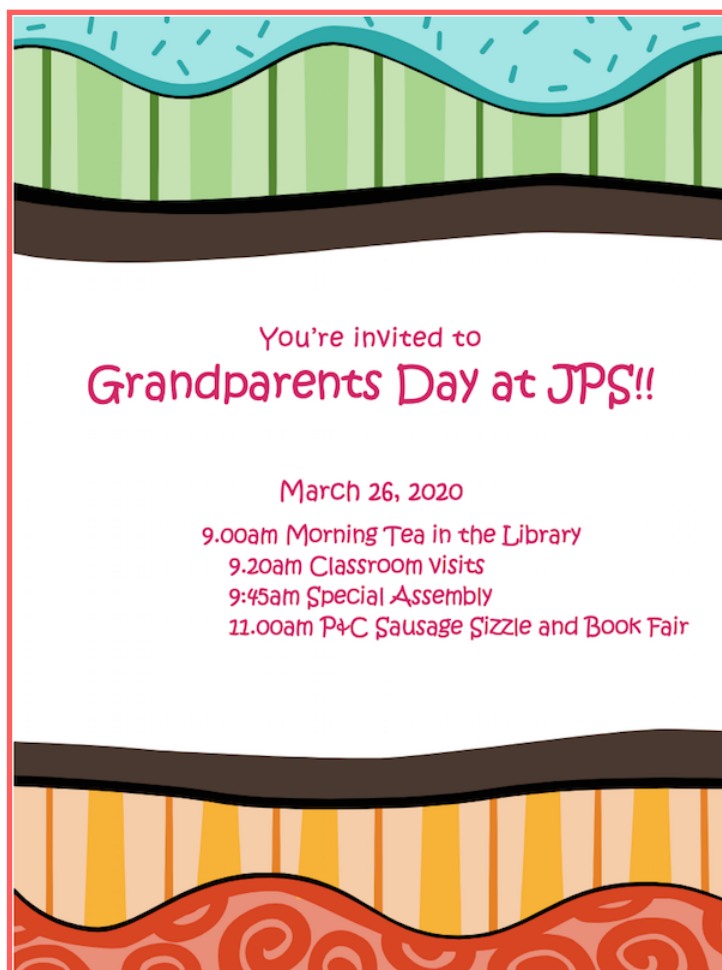

This week Tangalla became the first class to enjoy a Lego We Do experience, where they built and programmed a 'glowing snail'. They have now begun to prototype another animal to build and program, showcasing its special external features. Other classes have been experimenting with using QR codes, Google Apps for Education and the 'Show Me' app to conduct research and create digital content. Nuninoona are currently producing a virtual tour of our school using 360-degree cameras and Google Tour Creator.

For Grandparent's Day the library will host morning tea and a wonderful Scholastic Book Fair, where grandparents can purchase a book for their grandchildren. For every purchase, we earn points which we then use to purchase new books for our school library.

A reminder for all dragon-boating crew - training will be at 5pm tomorrow afternoon, and meeting at 9am on Saturday.

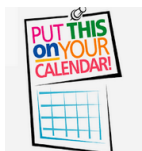

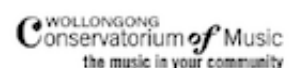
